

The Texas Forests & Water Forum 2022 convened collaborators who are intimately connected with efforts to protect healthy forests and clean water. The "forest-water connection" highlights the overlap of environmental and human health benefits derived from managing healthy forests and protecting drinking water sources. Nearly 100 stakeholders from the forestry, water, and conservation communities met on September 13-14 in Nacogdoches to explore the forest-water connection in Texas and to brainstorm specific ways to collaborate for the protection of these two important and interdependent resources.

#### **GOALS**

- **Branch Out:** Continue to build the coalition through engagement of new sectors and cooperators. Find partners to help you reach your sustainability aspirations. Identify overlapping goals and objectives for source water protection through forest retention and management,
- See the Forest for Its Trees: Explore the crucial role that managed forests play in improving drinking water. Get to know the longleaf pine ecosystem and other Texas forest types on the Winston 8 Ranch. Learn how comprehensive land stewardship practices such as timber management, habitat restoration, prescribed fire and invasive species control contribute to overall ecosystem health, and
- Safeguard Clean Water for the Future: Understand innovative water treatment approaches, including collaborative forest-drinking water projects. Implement conservation on the ground by establishing solid action steps, setting deadlines, and making achievable plans to enhance the Texas landscape. Put planning into action.

The Texas Forests & Water Forum 2022 was the result of an extensive planning effort led by The Longleaf Alliance, Texas Longleaf Team, TX Partnership, and SE Partnership. Joined by private landowners and representatives from Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, Texas Forestry Association, Texas Rural Water Association, and Houston-Galveston Area Council, planning team members volunteered their time to recruit participants and plan for meaningful presentations and an informative field trip focused on the connection between healthy forests and clean water in Texas.
